# AT A GIANCE

- Cool-season forage grass
- Cold and heat tolerant
- High dry-matter yield
- Hybrid of meadow fescue or tall fescue with perennial or Italian ryegrass
- Grows best on fertile soils with a pH of 5.5–7.0, but not recommended for poorly drained or lowfertility soils

- Performs well with snow cover, though not a permanent forage species making it suitable for cold weather.
